Architect Who Can Enter	Boston-born Wayne Stiles of Stiles & Van Kleek, a Boston firm, was commissioned to design and construct an 18-hole course in 1927. The layout is generally viewed as the most highly-regarded of his 76 courses that still exist. In 2008, renowned golf course architect Gil Hanse of Hanse Golf Course Design Inc. was retained by Taconic for a multi-million dollar renovation project, which was completed in the summer of 2009. Any female amateur golfer who has an active Mass Golf Membership and a Handicap Index® not exceeding 10.0 (at the time of registration). The player must have played and posted five rounds at any Mass Golf member club/course within 12 months of the entry close date.

Schedule of Play	 August 12 & 13: Stroke Play (18 holes/day) The low 32 players will advance to match play, beginning August 14. Any ties for the final Match Play qualifying place(s) will be determined by a hole-by-hole playoff, if needed, on August 16. August 14: Round of 32 (a.m.) and Round of 16 (p.m.) August 15: Quarterfinals (a.m.) and Semifinals (p.m.) August 16: Final Match (18 holes) 											
What the Winner Receives	The Amateur Champion is awarded the Championship Bowl. The winner is also exempt into the 2025 U.S. Women's Amateur Championship (if eligible). The Amateur Finalist receives the Curtis Memorial Trophy. The stroke play medalist(s) given an award. The low net qualifier for match play receives the Osgood Memorial Cup.											

2023 Champion	Rebecca Skoler (Pine Brook Country Club) won the 2023 Mass Women's Amateur at Dedham Country & Polo Club. Skoler, who attends the University of Virginia, had her short game dialed in throughout the final match, and never trailed against Westford teen Molly Smith (Vesper Country Club). She won the match 2&1, with a pair of clutch par puts on holes 16 and 17 hoisted the trophy for the first time. Skoler will not be back to defend her title this year, as she will be back with her college squad.
Championship History	The Massachusetts Women's Amateur Championship is the oldest championship conducted by Mass Golf. The first Massachusetts Women's Amateur was played in 1900 at Oakley Country Club, with Grace Keyes , a pioneer for women's amateur golf in the Bay State, winning the title. The championship has been contested every year except for 1918 and 1943-45 due to World War I and World War II, respectively.
	Notable past champions include Margaret Curtis (1901, 1907, 1908, 1914), Harriot Curtis (1920), Anne Marie Tobin (1988, 1991-1995, 2000), Joanne Goodwin (1954, 1956 1958, 1961), and Tara Joy Connelly (2003, 2013), all of whom have been inducted into the Massachusetts Golf Hall of Fame.
	The 2024 Women's Amateur marks the first time Taconic has hosted the championship. The last course in the Berkshires to host the championship was Wyantenuck Country Club in 2002 when Kelly Robb won the title.
